
#### PROGRESS REPORT TO SAMAA COMMITTEE

22 November 2012

This report is to be read in conjunction with bulletin 0 submitted to CIAM for final approval on 8<sup>th</sup> December 2012 and the budget for the event. Please note the budget does not contain any income or expenses from sponsors and advertisers and the production of the souvenir programme.

In consultation with and assistance from the SAMAA GM and the other members of the organizing committee the following details are complete or under negotiation:

- An expression of interest questionnaire was sent to all known possible countries with a
  positive response from 34 with 97 competitors 28 team managers and 77 supporters
  and helpers. 25 judges and jury members plus additional supporters and visitors should
  result in a foreign contingent of about 250.
- Judges resumes were requested with 53 replies from which a short list of 20 plus
  reserves has been selected for CIAM approval. Selection was based upon past
  performance and ability. 14 Judges have indicated that their companions are available
  as scribes resulting in a shortfall of 6 scribes which will be filled by local MAASA judges
  and seen as a learning/training experience.
- The services of MAASA members have been enlisted for media, website, scribing, scoring, CD, flight line and processing functions, field set up, welcoming and chaperone duties.
- The Local Model Dealers Association was approached for advertising and other support. So far only two have responded. We are now in direct contact with all possible industry related principals with some positive results.
- We have travelled the Midvaal area on some 12 occasions assessing flying practise
  sites, accommodation options etc. We are pleased to advise that the Tsogo Riverside Sun
  has offered discounted accommodation rates, donated 8 rooms, free banquet and meeting
  facilities amounting to R200 000. Further meetings are scheduled with them to fix matters
  such as transport, welcoming facilities at ORT, judges gear, and off-site entertainment for
  families etc.



- Reduced airfare sponsorships have been obtained from Emirates and SAA with further detailed meetings scheduled to fix the best deals.
- The Midvaal council has been contacted and meetings scheduled to determine Emergency and Traffic Control services.



- The various difficulties surrounding the Henley flying site are well known. A meeting has been held with Bob Lloyd. A local hobby store owner, and newly elected chairman of the reconstituted club. According to him a sublease for use of the facility until Feb. 2014 has been concluded with the farmer leasing the whole property. This property is still up for sale in toto and once sold a sub-division would then have to be made for the section housing the flying site. Apparently an offer by another modeller has been made for this section. We have been given the assurance that the W/C' remains on top of their priority list and the facilities are secured for this.
- My concern is that so far only some 20 members have rejoined the new club. They estimate
  that it will take some R108k annually to maintain the existing facilities. Major outstanding
  items are the provision of electricity, resealing of the runways and the access road to the
  second flight line. In addition we would need to rent a large marquee, and porta- loos for
  the W/C's. There is an obvious need for funding which has not been budgeted for.
- I believe the SAMAA management should take greater interest in preserving this facility for the long term and assisting a club in such distress. I estimate that some 80% of SAMAA members reside within 200 km's of this venue.
- The organising team are acutely aware of the precarious situation and none would be more embarrassed internationally than BOB and I should this situation flop.
- To this end we have identified an alternative potential venue that is even better equipped
  than Henley but with a price tag attached. In order to prevent gossip and possible
  undermining of existing negotiations, it will only be revealed in the event that Henley cannot
  be saved. Suffice to say that it will not impact on any of the arrangements made to date.

In conclusion thanks to the SAMAA management for now taking an interest in proceedings and as a reminder despite MOP's etc. that try and absolve SAMAA from this responsibility, it remains the legal entity that will be involved.
