

National Model Aircraft Championships 2014


From 24 th to 27 th April Underberg was host to the National Aerobatic Aeromodelling Championships in which some thirty pilots from all over the country took part. They came from places as diverse as Port Elizabeth and Gauteng and the weather was mostly superb with only one day of drizzle before the main events and a day of cold wind at the end. The event was held on the Polo grounds where the Underberg Farmers Association provided facilities at the UFA hall and was organized by Arthur Eggar who set up the entire operation on his own a fact that aroused considerable comment and congratulations from the participants who said the event was as well run as any of the best competitions held previously in South Africa. Few of the competitors had visited Underberg before and they were most impressed with the setting, the ambience and the facilities and said they would be back again at the first opportunity. Some also took the opportunity to drive up the Sani Pass a trip that they said was most worthwhile.

The competition is run along international lines and each pilot has to complete a set list of maneuvers within a time of eight minutes and remain within a defined area called a 'box' before the judges. The aircraft used are extremely sophisticated and can be called upon to perform most intricate maneuvers by radio control while flying at speeds up to more than 200 kilometers per hour. The aircraft of different designs are built of fibre glass with wingspans of nearly two meters and are driven by electric motors powered by a battery that weighs one kg, the heaviest part of the aircraft and which provides power for a period of at least ten minutes allowing plenty of time to complete the course. In all the value of the aircraft present was well over a million Rand.

The standard of competition was very high and those taking part included the reigning National Champion Andre Stockwell who was pipped at the post by Calvin Schroll who took the top honours and Roston Dugmore the Junior World champion who is due to go to Chicago shortly to defend his title There were four classes. Beginner, Standard, Advanced and Championship. Arthur Eggar took third place in the Advanced category against strong competition in that class.

The whole event went off perfectly the only casualty being one unfortunate Jackal Buzzard who entered controlled air space without authority of Air Traffic control. The aircraft although lightly damaged was able to continue in the competition but despite the best efforts of those present the Jackal Buzzard succumbed to his injuries.

At the prize giving a vote of thanks was proposed to the Underberg Polo Club for the use of their grounds and the UFA for their facilities which was accepted unanimously to loud applause. M. Clark.
